

Youth Opportunities Fund



Does your Key Club need financial support to help boost your productivity? Do you want to go to ICON next year, but it's a little too expensive? Do you have a dream project, but you don't think you can raise enough money to complete it? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may consider applying for a Youth Opportunities Fund Grant.

The Youth Opportunities Fund gives between \$100 and \$2000 USD to Key Club members or Key Clubs. If you complete an application, which can be found on the District's website, you may receive money from Key Club International. Last year, the International Board gave over \$80,000! Not all applicants receive the complete funding they desire, but the Board does grant partial funding, too, so you should definitely apply if you are considering it.
